

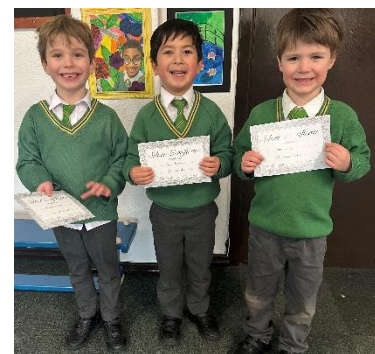

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR WORLD BOOK DAY – SHARE A STORY!

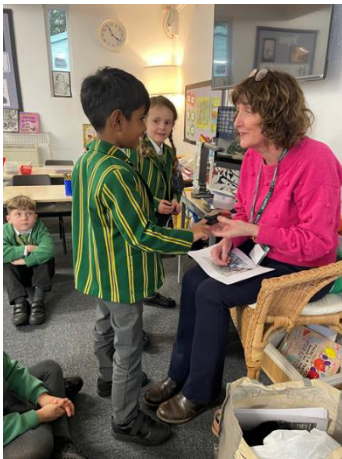
